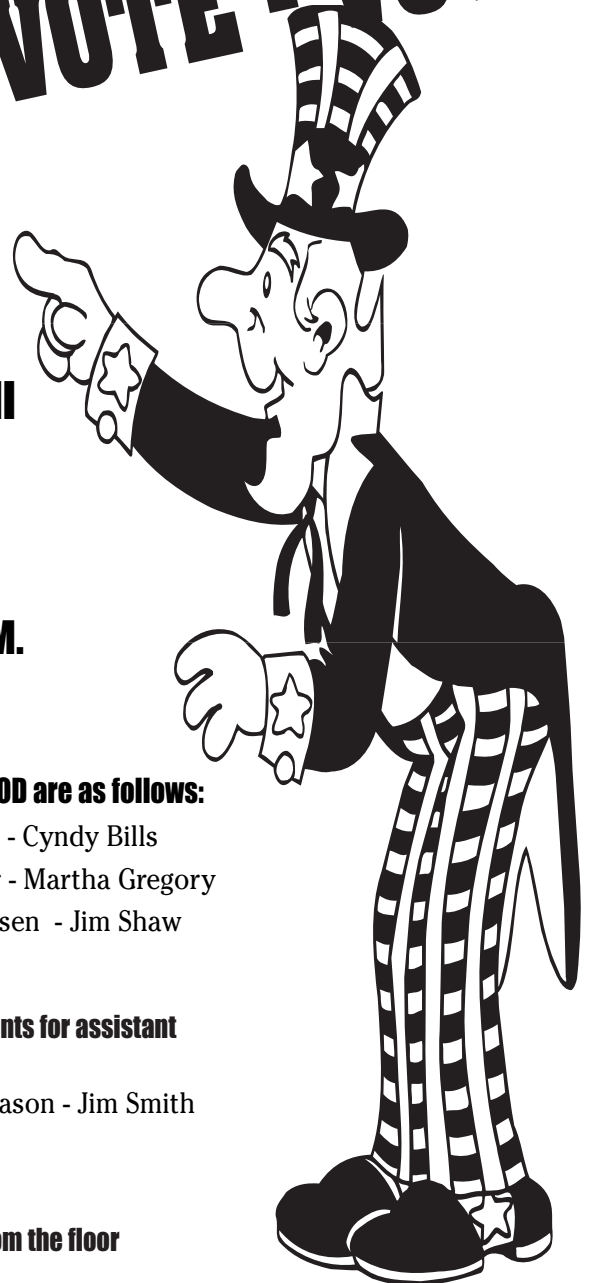

Personal Trips - LVSSC Policy

I have had requests to publish personal trips or excursions, etc from our fellow club members in the newsletter . I would like to clarify the Club policy and then tell you what we can do to help.

Analysis: If the club were to publish personal interest events, we have the potential of diluting interest in Club events because the events could be other ski events or similar trips and be in the same timeframe as the Club trips. A private trip published in the NL could be construed by a member as being a club function. If that trip went badly for whatever reason, then the club may take some heat or blame.

- The current BOD unanimously decided to not publish personal sponsored events and activities.

But here is what we can do:

1. If a member has a trip idea, they are welcome to contact the trip director to get it introduced to the board to have it considered for a club sponsored function.
2. If a person is interested in forming a special interest group, we can publish that persons name and then leave it up to the members to contact them. Currently, we have two special interest groups that I'm aware of: RV trips and Golf; For RV trips, contact Linda Decker; For golf, contact Dave Berry. Contact numbers are in the directory.
3. The bulletin board on the website in the member area is also available for ideas, equipment sales or other activities similar to that.

What's News....

....Well, I just got back from Colorado as I write this column and the skiing was great. We were blessed with good weather and snow conditions in Copper Mountain, Vail, and Keystone and the trip write up is contained in this newsletter. This was one of the best groups I have escorted and I look forward to seeing a lot more future participation in not only our winter trips, but also our non-ski destinations. If you want to ski or snowboard with the club this season, I think Gary may have a couple of seats left on Telluride and there is still space on Mammoth, but please hurry or it will be gone. Call your trip leaders as you read this column to express your interest in going. By the way, the snow in Mammoth is awesome this year. Hopefully, the Winter Olympics have inspired you and we would love to ski or snowboard with you this season.

Non-Ski Distant Trips....

Your Board has approved an additional non-ski trip for the coming season:

....The Navajo Enchantment Adventure will leave on Thursday, May 4, 2006 and return on Sunday, May 7, 2006. For those who haven't really explored the Navajo history and culture or experienced the unique scenic vistas of the southwest, this will be your trip. We will be driving to Chinle, located in eastern Arizona, on Thursday and overnight at the Holiday Inn. On Friday, our private Navajo guide will take us into Canyon de Chelly, a Y-shaped Canyon with 1,000-foot vertical walls where Navajo ruins and petroglyphs abound. Learn about the Trail of Tears and how the Canyon played an important role in the survival of the Navajo, some of whom are still farming and residing in the Canyon to this day. We will then travel to Kayenta, located on the Navajo reservation, and overnight at the Holiday Inn there. On Saturday, we will travel to Monument Valley, where sandstone monoliths rise thousands of feet above the desert floor. Monument Valley is the movie producer's favorite location for filming westerns and you will recognize many of the movies filmed there. We will then overnight in Williams, Arizona and enjoy our group

dinner at Max and Irma's. On Sunday, we will board the Grand Canyon Railroad and ride to the South Rim of the Grand Canyon, one of the Seven Wonders of the World. Enjoy pastries and coffee in the morning on the Train. The whole day will be spent exploring the many vistas in of the Canyon and those that wish to do a little hiking can take the Bright Angel Trail into the Canyon. Alcoholic beverages and food will be available in the afternoon in our Club Car on the return train ride to Williams. We will then have you back into Vegas around 9:00 PM Sunday evening. If you love scenic photography, the vistas are awesome and you will get some stunning shots. This trip is only \$399 based on double occupancy so please take a look at the flyer in the newsletter and/or contact your Peggy Carson, the trip captain, Chris Philippsen, the assistant trip captain, or myself at 602.821.4987 if you want to go. The date is coming up fast and we need to get a tentative count of who might be interested.

....Gary Wattenbarger and Pat Parks will be your trip captains for the 4th of July Napa Valley Wine Tour. On Independence Day weekend, your club will be going to Napa Valley to learn about and experience first-hand the nuances of wine-making. This will be a Premier Wine Tasting Tour that will visit 12 of the finest wineries in the Napa Valley area with all ground transportation via private motor coach and private group tastings at each winery. Based on the preferences of the group participants, we will visit wineries that have the broadest appeal to our group. We will fly into Oakland via Southwest, enjoy deluxe accommodations at the River Terrace Inn, a group dinner, shopping, and fine dining during this great holiday weekend away from the summer heat. This trip will run only \$679 per person double occupancy for air, accommodations, ground transportation, 12 wine tastings, group dinner, taxes, and gratuities. ....In August, your club will offer another unique combination of activities on August 18-20, 2006. Join your friends for a nice cool weekend in the Sierra Nevada's during our Truckee River Rafting Tour. After flying into Reno, you will enjoy deluxe accommodations in two-bedroom, two-

The fun starts with an eco-adventure hike on Saturday and after lunch, we will raft the Truckee River followed by a group dinner in the Village at Squaw. Talk about scenic....the red sandstone cliffs that rise thousands of feet vertically out of the water are just stunning and are a photographer's dream. This one will fill and cannot be expanded. Lake Powell is a once-in-a-lifetime, must-do activity and this will be a fun way to enjoy nature at its best. At only \$429 including transportation, accommodations, all your food and booze, and the ambience of a deluxe houseboat, this trip is a great value. The Phoenix Ski Club will also be on the Lake at the same time and we will try and join them for a joint party.
