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# Membership Application Enclosed

It is that time of year to send out the Membership renewal application and ask for your continued support of the Las Vegas Ski and Sports club.

The Board has voted to accept annual memberships starting July 1st of each year. Please notice that there has been a dues increase from \$40.00 to \$45.00 this year. There are several mitigating factors that made this action necessary:

- \* First, this increase is required to cover the club's base level expenses that we incur just to operate the club.
- \* The club has reduced a lot of expenses over the last two years but has still been incurring a net loss.
- \* We are not a government so we cannot deficit spend or sell bonds to fund the club.
- \* Insurance liability premiums have increased dramatically, beyond our budget plan.
- \* Our membership dropped from 220 to 165 which reduced revenue.

To counter the membership reduction trend, the current board has put together several plans to help boost our membership and future revenue. I reported on those plans last month, plus we have a new exciting trip schedule that is being rolled out. We hope that these new changes will make this a great club to stay a member of and a great club to join. The board will pay the dues increase the same as everybody else. We sincerely hope that you will continue to consider the Las Vegas Ski & Sports Club the best value in Las Vegas.

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## **Helpful Tips:**

# **New Passport Requirements.**

The U.S Department of State will soon require a passport to travel to and from the Caribbean, Bermuda, Panama, Canada or Mexico. The requirement will be rolled out in phases to enable travelers to meet the terms of the new guidelines.

- December 31, 2005 – Passport or other accepted document required for all air and sea travel to or from the Caribbean, Bermuda, Central and South America.
- December 31, 2006 – Passport or other accepted document required for all air and sea travel to or from Mexico and Canada.
- December 31, 2007 – Passport or other accepted document required for all air and sea and land border crossings.

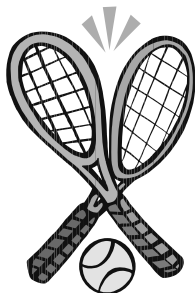

## *Hiking & Camping Trip*

From Las Vegas, go north on U.S. Highway 95 to the junction of Highway 157. Turn left, travel approximately 17 miles to the junction of Highway 158. Turn right, travel about 4 miles to the campground. Campground is on the right side of the highway.

### **Activities:**

There are 2 short hikes nearby: Robber's Roost, a moderate 20 minute loop; and Fletcher Canyon Trail, a moderate 30 minute one-way hike. For the more adventurous, there is the North Loop Trail that offers access to Charleston Peak, Mummy Mountain and the South Loop Trail. This, done in its entirety, is a very strenuous hike. However, you can go part way and turn around and come back the same way. There are several other trails within car-pooling distance.

### **Weather:**

The campsite is at 8400 feet, so nights will be cool, and days pleasant for hiking in shorts. Remember to bring water, sunscreen, and a hat.

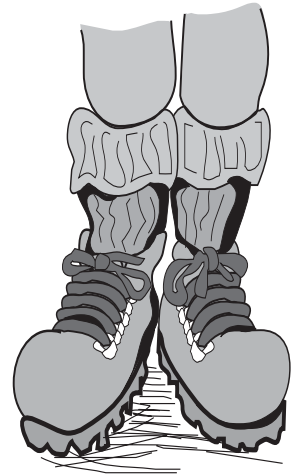
